This LibriVox album consists of the four short stories Arthur Conan Doyle wrote about Sherlock Holmes that are nonetheless excluded from the canon. The first and fourth stories, "The Field Bazaar" and "How Watson Learned the Trick", are considered companion pieces due to both stories consisting entirely of conversations between Holmes and Watson over breakfast. Most scholars consider these two stories to be parodies and therefore not part of the canon. The second and third stories, "The Lost Special" and "The Man with the Watches", are not part of the canon because neither story mentions Holmes by name, although literary scholars have proposed that an unnamed character in each story is intended to be Holmes.
